Keith Johnson discussed how our student fees are being affected. Keith discussed the new tuition model being implemented in Fall of 2019. Plan was submitted to the Board's office the previous Spring. Program fees will now be collapsed into 10 instructional fee categories. This change is cost neutral for the students and revenue neutral for the college and simplifies the understanding of the fees for students.
