

Articulation Agreement

Minot State University (MiSU) and North Dakota State College of Science (NDSCS)

January 11, 2021

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to:

1. Enable students who have earned their Associate of Applied Science Degree (AAS) in Nursing from North Dakota State College of Science to transfer to Minot State University and enter the BSN Completion Program. The AAS in Nursing would not be considered MiSU general education complete. The agreement will provide a structure through which transfer articulation on all levels can be supported.
2. Enable students who have earned their Associate of Science Degree (AS) in Nursing from the North Dakota State College of Science to transfer to Minot State University and enter the BSN Completion Program. The AS in Nursing would be considered MiSU General Education Complete.

Therefore, it would be understood and agreed that courses taken at NDSCS are considered equally transferable to Minot State University's BSN Completion Program and NDUS GERTA applies to the articulation agreement.

Transfer Requirements for the AAS and AS in Nursing from NDSCS include:

1. Complete an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing (AAS) or Associate of Science Degree (AS) in Nursing from NDSCS.
 - a. Students may apply to MiSU and the BSN Completion Program as early as Spring in the final semester of the NDSCS AAS or AS Nursing Program. Conditional MiSU BSN Completion Program acceptance will be granted until NDSCS AAS or AS Nursing degree has been posted.
2. Apply for admission to MiSU.
 - a. Applicants must meet the MiSU admission requirements for transfer students <https://www.minotstateu.edu/enroll/transfer/>.
 - b. Meet the MiSU admission requirement of a minimum GPA of 2.0. Meet the BSN Completion Program admission requirement of a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75.
 - c. Complete the MiSU online application for admission. https://app.applyyourself.com/AYApplicantLogin/fl_ApplicantConnectLogin.asp?id=minotstate.
 - d. Pay \$35.00 MiSU admission application fee.
 - e. Submit official academic records from your previous institutions. If you have previously attended an NDUS institution, MiSU will be able to retrieve your academic transcript(s) from any NDUS institution you attended once you have applied to MiSU.
3. Meet all deadlines set by MiSU.
4. Complete MiSU BSN Completion Program application and submit \$25.00 application fee.
5. Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. If the cumulative GPA <2.75, conditional acceptance may be agreed upon on an individual basis.
6. A minimum grade of "C" is required for all previous nursing courses.
7. A Minimum grade of "C" is required in all MiSU BSN Completion Program courses and required support course to progress in the program.
8. Be in good standing with prior institutions.

9. Pass NCLEX-RN
 - a. Submit proof of current U.S. unencumbered RN license to Minot State University Department of Nursing.
 - i. Conditional program acceptance will be granted for students that have not yet passed their NCLEX-RN; classes that can be taken prior to having an RN license are the following: general education courses, required support course, NURS 363, NURS 383, and special topic course(s).
10. Meet with MiSU BSN Completion Program Director to review prior course work and develop a plan of study.
11. Provide MiSU BSN Completion Program with documentation of all requirements through the approved format (e.g. immunizations, CPR, personal health insurance, NCLEX-RN license, and specific trainings and acknowledgment forms) and complete the online BSN completion program online orientation. See the MiSU DON Handbook for a complete list of all requirements.
12. Should a final transcript or licensure status indicate the applicant has not met the above admission requirements, conditional acceptance will be withdrawn and the student will be required to reapply to the program in a future semester. The applicant will not be considered as admitted to the program to continue with enrollment in nursing courses without valid NCLEX-RN licensure. Enrollment in courses outside of the nursing major (general education, elective, special topic course(s), and statistics), however, may proceed.
13. NCLEX-RN examination credit consists of 40 semester hours posted to the students MiSU official transcript during the semester of graduation. The examination credit validates the student's successful completion of the licensure exam. The NCLEX-RN examination credit is also designed to help students meet the graduation requirement of having a minimum of 60 semester hours completed at a 4-year institution.
14. Have access to a computer with high-speed internet and virus protection. MSU technology requirements: https://www.minotstateu.edu/online/pages/tour_and_skills/tour_04.shtml

Total Number of Transferrable Credits

There is no maximum number of transfer credits that can be accepted and applied toward degree completion at Minot State University. This does not preclude Minot State University's Degree requirements of:

1. Minimum of 30 semester hour credits earned directly from Minot State University
2. Minimum of 60 semester hour credits cumulatively from a four-year institution (NCLEX-RN examination credit of 40 semester hours can be applied to fulfill the required 60 semester hours)
3. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required in order to graduate

A minimum grade of a “C” is required.

NOTE: Statistics must be taken either before or during the same semester as NURS 363 Nursing Theory and Research.


Joint Obligations:

Minot State University and North Dakota State College of Science will exchange data and documents as agreed that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of the transfer agreements, and promote effective cooperation between the two institutions.


Monitoring, Review, and Agreement Longevity:

Both parties shall each name a principal contact person/office to the partnership program; further, these individuals (or department representative) will be responsible for coordination related to the partnership program and the flow of communication within their own institution. All agreements must be reviewed for updates with signatures of representatives or delegates at least every five years.


This articulation agreement may be discontinued by either educational partner by submitting written notification to the other partner one year prior to the identified cancellation date in order to protect all students transferring between these institutions.






