# Adding, Dropping and Swapping Classes

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## Adding Classes

1. Log on to **CampusConnection**.
2. On the Student Homepage, click on the Manage Classes tile.
3. Sign Financial Obligation Agreement found at the bottom of the menu on the left.
4. Using the **Class Search and Enroll**, students will first select their term and institution.
5. Search for class using the Class Number—click on the double arrow to the right.
6. Once the class is selected, click arrow to the right.
7. Step 1 of 4 (Review Class Selection), click next in the upper right corner.
8. Bypass Step 2 of 4 by clicking on “Accept” in right corner. This screen will be used if your class has variable credits.
9. Step 3 of 4 – Enroll or add to cart – choose “**Add to Shopping Cart**” – click next.
10. Step 4 of 4 – Review and Submit – click on Submit.
11. When asked if you are sure – choose YES.
12. Repeat above steps for **EACH** class is which you are enrolling for the term by returning to the **Class Search and Enroll** option on the left side.
13. Once you have added all your classes to your shopping cart, click on **Shopping Cart** in left column.
14. Select all classes by clicking on the box next to the class – click on **Validate** to check for any conflicts. If ok, click on **Enroll**.
15. When asked if you are sure, click YES.
16. Once enrolled, go to “**My Weekly Schedule**” in left column, choose “list view” > select proper term > printer friendly view > Print. To print a “weekly calendar view” select “return to my class schedule” and choose “weekly view” > Print.
17. Click on (image here) in the upper right corner to sign out when completed.

## Search Course Schedule for Available Classes

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1. Log on to **CampusConnection**.
2. On the Student Homepage, click on **Manage Classes** tile.
3. In the left navigation menu, click **Browse Course Catalog**.
4. Select North Dakota State College of Science, choose term, course subject and course number (if known).
5. Available sections will be denoted with an availability icon
  - Open = green circle
  - Closed = blue square
  - Wait List = orange triangle
6. Click on **Section** for course details (course fees, prerequisites, course description general education, course restrictions, etc.)

## Dropping Classes

**Note:** Dropping a class may have an impact on your Financial Aid. Before dropping a class, please contact Enrollment Services to see if the change in course credits will affect your financial aid award. Classes that are dropped after the 100% refund period are not eligible for a refund of tuition costs. See page 6 for additional information.

1. On the Student Homepage, click on the **Manage Classes** tile.
2. Click on the **Drop Classes** tab.
3. Select the checkbox for the class you wish to drop.
4. Click **Drop Selected Classes**.
5. Verify the course(s) you wish to drop and complete the process.
6. Watch for success or error messages. (Note: Courses with errors are not removed from your schedule.)

## Swapping Classes

1. On the Student Homepage, click on the **Manage Classes** tile.
2. Click on **Swap Classes**.
3. Select the correct term.
4. Select the class you wish to swap.
5. Enter the Class Number or search for the class you want to add.
6. Complete the process.
7. View the results. The Status Field will display a check mark if it's a successful swap, or an X if an error has occurred.
8. Click **My Class Schedule** to confirm.

## View/Print My Class Schedule

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1. Log on to **CampusConnection**.
2. On the Student Homepage, click on **Manage Classes** tile.
3. Click on **View My Classes** or **My Weekly Schedule**.
  - If eligible for multiple terms/semesters, careers and institutions, multiple options will appear. Select the appropriate options if applicable.
4. Select filter options for classes to be displayed (enrolled, dropped and waitlisted classes) then click the ‘filter’ button.
5. Click on **Printer Friendly Page**.
6. Select **Print** from browser menu bar.

**NOTE:** If you wish to display only those courses in which you are enrolled, make sure you have unchecked the Show Dropped Courses box.

**NOTE: Print list view before printing weekly view to remove the menu bar on the left.**

## 2020-21 Tuition and Fees

Tuition is charged per-credit and is based on the RESIDENCY of the student. Fees are charged per-credit and are based on factors such as enrolled credits, class prefix and location of the class (Wahpeton, Fargo, Online). Costs are subject to change without notice.

### Instructional Fees

In addition to tuition and mandatory fees, Instructional Fees help support the particular needs of specific classes. ### Paying Your Bill

Students have 24/7 access to their account through CampusConnection. Here, students can pay their bill and keep track of their account status. NDSCS will notify students via their NDSCS student email account when statements are available for viewing and/or printing on CampusConnection.

NDSCS accepts payments in person at our Wahpeton and Fargo locations, by phone or through the CampusConnection payment link. Log in to CampusConnection > Financial Account > Pay Online Now. When paying by credit card, NDSCS does not charge a fee. Visa, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

Payment of tuition, fees, room and board, etc. for each semester is expected on or before the semester payment due dates.

## Dropping Classes or Withdrawing from NDSCS

Dropping classes after the semester has started can negatively affect a student's NDSCS account balance, their ability to receive current and future financial aid and their college transcript. Students should consider the following information before dropping any classes:

- Students are encouraged to meet with their advisor or Student Success before making changes to their schedule.
- **Academic Drop Dates** are often different than **Tuition Refund Dates**.
  - Review the NDSCS Drop/Withdrawal/Refund Schedule carefully at [NDSCS.edu/DropAndWithdraw](https://www.ndscs.edu/DropAndWithdraw) to determine how dropping the applicable class will affect the student's college transcript and/or the availability to receive a tuition refund.
  - The final day to drop a class without receiving an "earned" grade on the student's transcript varies depending on the start/end dates.
  - A final grade is considered "earned" after the last day to drop the class.

### Procedures for Dropping or Withdrawing

Students who are enrolled for the current semester, and choose to no longer attend classes for the remainder of the semester, need to initiate that request through Student Success. Student Success will determine if the request qualifies as a "Class Drop" or a "Term Withdrawal". The effective date is the date of notification to Student Success.

**Note:** A final grade is considered "earned" after the last day to drop the class.

**Class Drop:** Student chooses to drop one or more of their classes but remain enrolled in at least one class within the semester.

- Dropping some, but not all, classes during a semester can be done by the student in CampusConnection.
- Dropping all classes cannot be done through CampusConnection; the student needs to initiate this request through Student Success.

- If a student requests to drop all remaining classes and a final grade has been earned in at least one class within the current semester, the request will be processed as a “Class Drop” rather than a “Term Withdrawal”.

**Term Withdrawal:** Student requests to be withdrawn from all classes within the semester (no final grade has been earned for any class).

- If a student requests to drop all classes and a final grade has not been earned in any class within the current semester, the request may qualify as a “Term Withdrawal”. If a final grade has been earned in at least one class within the current semester, the request will be processed as a “Class Drop” rather than a “Term Withdrawal” for the remaining classes.
- Student needs to initiate a “Term Withdrawal” request through Student Success.

## Financial Impacts of Dropping or Withdrawing

- NDSCS is required to follow the ND State Board of Higher Education Policy and Procedure 830.2 regarding class drops and/or withdrawals.
  - Refund eligibility is based on the date on which the drop/withdrawal is effective. See the NDSCS Drop/Withdrawal/Refund Schedule for specific session dates at [NDSCS.edu/DropAndWithdraw](http://NDSCS.edu/DropAndWithdraw).
  - Any cost adjustments to a student’s original charges will first be applied to the semester’s outstanding NDSCS balance before a refund is issued to the student (if applicable).
  - A class that is dropped prior to the completion of 9% of the class session will receive a 100% refund of tuition and fees for the number of credits related to the dropped class. After 9% of the class session, no refund of tuition and fees will be received.
- **Financial Aid Recipients** - All or a portion of financial aid may be returned to the funding source, based on the remaining number of credits for the semester and/or the date of withdrawal. This return of funds will be charged to the student’s NDSCS account, which may result in a balance owed to NDSCS. The balance will be the student’s responsibility to pay. Students who withdraw may be ineligible for federal student aid at NDSCS in the future.

## Graduation

Students are requested to complete their petition for graduation when they register for their last semester of attendance. The petitions are found online at **NDSCS.edu** under **Current Students > Graduation**. A paper copy may be obtained from your Dean's office or the Enrollment Services office. Failure to complete the petition in a timely manner may result in exclusion from the graduation activities and publications and/or the annual Student Recognition ceremony in May, if eligible.

## Student Support Services

### Academic and Career Counseling

# Online Course Information

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## Cost

Tuition for online classes is charged per-credit and is based on the RESIDENCY of the student. Fees are charged per-credit and are based on factors such as enrolled credits, class prefix and location of the class (Wahpeton, Fargo, Online). **Online classes will have a per-credit Distance Access Fee in addition to the per-credit tuition rate.** Tuition and fees exclude books and supplies. Costs are subject to change without notice.

## E-mail Required...Stay Connected

NDSCS email is the required method of communication for online classes and for NDSCS. Students need to check their email often for notices from the college and instructors. Instructions to access NDSCS email are at [NDSCS.edu/IT-Setup](https://ndscs.edu/IT-Setup).

## Accessing Online Classes

Students log into online classes by going to [NDSCS.edu](https://ndscs.edu) and clicking *NDSCS Online*. Enter your CampusConnection User ID and Password and click "Login." Go to the "Courses" tab and click the title of your class to begin. Log into your classes the first day of the semester to check for assignment due dates.

**NOTE: Online classes will not be visible on your NDSCS Online > MyNDSCS page until the first day of the semester or session in which they begin.**

## Online Class Assignment Schedules

**Online classes are NOT self-paced. Students should log into class frequently and keep up with assignments to avoid losing grade points.** Instructors set deadlines for assignments and exams to be submitted and students have 24/7 access to the online class content to do their work. Log into class on the first class day so instructors know which students are "active."

Contact instructors if you need to be out of class for an extended period of time for illness or emergency. Students who do not remain active in their online classes by logging in and submitting assignments weekly may be dropped according to the NDSCS "Attendance Policy" at [NDSCS.edu/Online-Support](https://ndscs.edu/Online-Support).

## Computer Expectations

Students are responsible for maintaining computer access to online classes. *Prepare for technical problems by having access to another computer to keep up with online course work.* Missing assignment deadlines may result in lost grade points.

**NOTE:** Some courses require Windows PC computers because Macs are not compatible with software used. Students need access to a PC for these courses.

## Test Proctors

**Test Proctors are required for many online course exams.**

Local students may use the NDSCS-Wahpeton Test Center in Old Main (701-671-2256). Fargo area students may use NDSCS-Fargo for test services (701-231-6900). **When using other proctor locations or services, additional charges may apply.**

Proctors cannot be a student, friend or relative but must be someone in a location such as at a test center, library, school or college, or possibly a job supervisor. Instructors may have suggestions they will accept. When required, proctor information forms and instructions will be available in the online class.

## Books and Software Requirements

Books **are** required for online classes and can be purchased from the NDSCS Bookstore. **Some classes require access codes which come bundled with the NDSCS book.** If you get access codes from another source, you may not have the correct code configured for NDSCS classes and may need to purchase another code.

Microsoft Word is required for all classes. Students can download the **Microsoft Office software FREE** through their NDSCS email account. Find instructions at [NDSCS.edu/Online-Support](https://ndscs.edu/Online-Support).

Additional software may be required for some classes and will be indicated in the online class schedules at [NDSCS.edu/CourseSchedules](https://ndscs.edu/CourseSchedules).
