They would give examples of testimonies that have been used in the past and how to get good research for

This would be a state constitutional amendment and NDSA already has a challenging time with this. This concluded that a resolution coming from the NDSA is going to carry more power than one from NDSCS or VCSU. The third student concern brought up dealt with House Bill 1404. This senator had concerns with recent events that happened around their campus. The senator suggested that we allow concealed carry on campuses so that students can defend themselves in case of an intruder. There has already been a resolution written in opposition to HB 1404 stating that there would be mental health risks and the potential of having more suicide attempts. Having concealed carry on campuses could also risk student and campus safety. It was determined that if this were to come up in the General Assembly, it would not pass. This discussion was tabled indefinitely. The next topic of discussion was the NDSA Guidebook. They wanted to get ideas on how to explain each committee within the NDSA better. This may lead to another taskforce being created. The exec team was going to send out an email to each head delegate to get information from their senate boards, but it was determined that they could just put it as a question on the NDSA feedback surveys. The last concern that was brought up at the last NDSA meeting, was the use of State Fleet Vehicles. An institution reached out and said that they are not allowed to bring anyone that is not on the student senate and wanted to know if other institutions were having the same problem. There was only one other institution that had the same problem.

SAC

 Talked about the current social media posts and how to improve it. They also discussed how to get more members to join senate or NDSA. There was a discussion about NDSA councils and if anyone would like to join.

GA

 Sammy Weber was confirmed at the Vice President of Communications. The resolution involving diversity and equity was tabling indefinitely. The fee bylaw change proposal had its first reading and the resolution in support of the bylaw change was tabled until next month. Since this resolution was tabled, it will no longer get to the State Board of Higher Education in time for the Chancelor to review it. He will be making a fee increase decision without the NDSA's input. There were two amendments added to the Diversity and Equity Tuition Waiver Resolution. The resolution was passed by the GA with both amendments.

- Breakout Sessions
 - The breakout session was just NDSCS. Talked about how to improve the NDSA attendance. Discussed how NDSCS requires us to go to two NDSAs per semester and how this tends to be more strict than other institutions. Had a quick discussion about the social media influence and increasing NDSA requirements and scholarships in general.

- Students Fees Presentation
 - Melissa Johnson, Associate Vice President of Student Affairs
 - There are three fees that were discussed with President Flanigan that he has approved to move forward with. Last year, there was a shift in some of the student fees that now go through the president's office and get approved. They then come to the Student Senate for our consideration alongside any increases of fees are directly related to programming, CAB, Senate, Student Center, etc. There are no fees being proposed for these things this year. This discussion is more so for our information so that we understand what some of the other fees will look like moving forward. Dr. Flanigan wants to advocate for an increase to a portion of the athletic department fees that go toward the pool. There will be an increase to the intramural fee. Dr. Flanigan is passionate about wanting to offer students activities and events. Some students say there is a lot to do, and others say that there is nothing to do. There is a QR Code that students can scan to give feedback on what events they would like to see on campus. The budget for counseling will be bumped up to help the Student Health & Wellness Department. There is a software program called Medicat, which will allow the campus clinic to track documents, visits, notes, etc. This program will also allow the enrollment process to go 80% faster than it usually does as Medicat will be able to put a student's immunization forms and they do not have to spend time searching for them.
 - Residential Life Housing rates on average are being proposed to increase by 5% in the next year. The calculations and numbers were on a sheet that was handed to the Student Senate board.

Shown is a table of what the cost of single and double rooms will be, along with the campus apartments. Over the next ten years, there are plans to turn over six units at a time renovating the town homes.

- Dining Services rates on average are being proposed to increase by 4% in the next year. They want to ensure that they have the ability to address and replace some of their equipment on an annual basis.
- Cloy Tobola, Chief Information Officer
 - President Flanigan, Melissa, and a few others met today to look at where they are spending their fee dollars. There are lot of people in the IT Department, but they do not have somebody to make sure systems are "talking" to each other. The IT Department used to have someone that did this, but years ago, the position was cut. IT went to President Flanigan and told him that they needed to create this position and they looked at the student tech fee. They agreed that \$1.67 would be used per credit, which would be an increase, to fund this new position. They are not going to be able to fund this position right away but will start to move in that direction. NDSCS only charges a tech fee for twelve credits. A student can take eighteen credits but will only be charged for twelve credits.
- Mathew Schur, Director of Residential and Student Life
 - Residential Life's goal is to keep the student's wants and needs in mind when thinking about the resident halls. Most students do not want long hallways with communal bathrooms. They want more apartment style suites and rooms. They want to give students the feeling of independence when living in the resident halls.

 - At our last meeting, we talked about adding the Marketing Committee and it was brought back to Exec and it was decided that there will be two to three senators on this committee. This committee will help advocate for Student Senate and student activities on campus. They would go under the Student Life account. The senators on this committee could create posters to share on campus and help promote NDSA.
 - Senator Klindt moved to approve the Marketing Committee. Senator Parks seconded the motion. Motion carries.
 - Senator Parks, Senator Klindt, and Senator Maudal are interested in joining the Marketing Committee. Senator Parks will be chairing this committee.

- Student Recognition & Graduation Committee

There were comments about wanted more variety, higher meat quality, and less processed food. Dining Services implemented Willies's Burger Bar in the Wildcat Express. This gave them new burgers to work with and TacoCat was something fresh as well as a different variety. In the Dining Hall, they started the pizza and pasta bar daily because it was what students wanted. A few months into her position, Heather and the dining staff noticed that there were some students misusing the buffest style in the Dining hall by trying to consume an unlimited amount of food. Students would load up multiple plates and not eat all of it. The rest would be dumped in the trash bins. The reason the Dining Hall is buffet style is because there are some students who would like to eat more than others. The Wildcat Express was implemented to be simpler for students that just wanted the one option. The number of people that were abusing the buffet system was becoming increasingly worse. Dining Services were going through so much food that they could not keep up with the students. A lot of the food was going into the trash and not being eaten. This is part of the reason the to-go boxes were taken away. Students were filling both sides of their box, and some students would take as much as they could fit and then share it with another student so that they would not have to use their meal swipes. After students came back

from Spring Break, the to-go boxes were gone, and they noticed the immediate drop of how much food they had to make. Because of the drop in production, it takes a lot of stress off the kitchen. Since Dining Services do not have to focus on production as much, they can now focus on continuing to work on staff training and potentially the quality of food can now go up.

 - Legislative Priorities brought up with the topic of the library.

Discussed the Minnesota North Star Promise and how other institutions within the NDUS system are thinking of putting forward something similar. NDSCS decided that we need to do a better job of promoting what we already have. Next meeting is May 21st at 8 a.m.
 - Diversity & Equity Team ------ Senator Makuach
 - Discussed how much they have used in their budget so far and how much is left. They ordered more tampons and pads for our dispensers in Fargo and Wahpeton. Pride in the Park is on August 10, 2024, and they will be getting the gold level package that is

worth \$2,500. The Diversity and Equity Team wants to do something for Agawasie Day to represent Diversity and Equity, such as giving out some popcorn bags or another idea. Talked about Safe Zone Selfies for the months of June for Pride Month, August for Pride in the Park, and October for Nation Coming Out Day. They would have workers and students taking pictures with our pride shirts on to compile pictures for a poster to show students how they have a lot of people on campus that are safe to talk to. The ACHA NCHA survey was discussed, and it was found out that NDSCS was one of the best response rates in the nation. There are some students and athletes who are not able to afford higher meal plans and are unable to each more than two meals a day. These individuals are upset even more since to-go boxes were taken away. Someone brought up having rainbow cords for graduation.

SLAC

Lisa Johnson gave an OER update and let us know that they have organized a statewide OER conference and are inviting students to attend. This is in Bismarck, ND on April 15th. An ND Higher Education Day was brought up because it would give students and senators a chance to interact with legislators. There was a resolution in Support of Mirroring State Law Pertaining to Medical Marijuana on Campuses. NDSA has been looking for a stance on medical marijuana as an institution. A resolution in Support of Alternative Pathways to Teacher Licensure was created in response to the teacher shortage in North Dakota. This is a way to ensure that student teacher candidates could be hired by the school they are teacher candidates at. They would sign a contract saying they would be willing to work at that school in the position they are a teacher candidate for. A resolution Pertaining to Gun Carry on Campuses was in opposition to open gun carry on NDUS college campuses. This just restates the NDSA's opinion in case something was to change during the upcoming legislative session. A resolution Pertaining to Open Educational Resources was created to help develop action plans for the utilization and implementation of OERs. There are not a lot of OERs available to students and implementing them would push free and paid resources to produce better content. Most OERs are seen in Gen Ed courses, but they are looking to have them available in nursing, business, computer science, etc. A resolution in Opposition to the Expansion of Sports Betting was brought forward as there have been issues with students developing gambling addictions. Sports betting is illegal in North Dakota and there have been some ideas about banning it from NDUS networks. All resolutions passed to the General Assembly. The PAR Taskforce wanted to extend their deadline, but it was decided that it would be better as a special committee so that there would be no deadline.

• Discussed NDSA recruitment baskets and what could be included in them. For example, pizza cutters, stickers, ice scrapers, frisbees, etc. The Virtual Attendance Program is being abused and was amended. The policy now states that forms must be sent in from head delegates in order to have the privilege of attending or voting online. The NDUS Humanities Curriculum resolution is in support of humanities credits advertised and taught at any NDUS institution. This resolution was sent to the General Assembly. An Attendance-Based Grading resolution is in the process of being written. There was a resolution in support of using AI as a tool rather than solution in classrooms.

• There was a first reading for both the constitutional changes and the budget, which will be voted on at the next NDSA. There was a change to the online attendance policy that will be voted on at the next NDSA. The Policy, Advocacy, and Research Taskforce was changed to a special committee so it will not be ending at the end of the year. All proposed resolutions passed. Katie Kemple from UND was awarded Outstanding Officer, Kiara Radke from VCSU was awarded Outstanding Head Delegate. Hayden Larson from NDSCS and Carter Gill from VCSU were awarded Most Dedicated Delegates. Greg Stemens was awarded Student Advocate. Sadie Hansen from UND was awarded NDSA Legacy. The first round of nominations for executive positions was in March, delegates have the chance to be nominated or withdraw their nominations at the UND NDSA.
