¹Per-credit fees are based on class location; help to support such things as classroom technology, job placement, on-campus student activities, University System software, etc. Mandatory Fees cap at 12 credits per semester. Online Access Fee does not camp. Rates shown above are based on classes taken at the Wahpeton location.

- Wahpeton Classes: Student Activity \$22.77, ConnectND \$5.50, Technology \$10.49, and NDSA \$0.04 = \$38.80
- Fargo Classes: Student Activity \$9.28, ConnectND \$5.50, Technology \$10.49, and NDSA \$0.04 = \$25.31
- Online Classes: Student Fee \$2.00, ConnectND \$5.50, Technology \$10.49, and NDSA \$0.04 = \$18.03
- Online Access Fee \$38.00 per credit (no cap).

²Instructional Fees will be charged per-credit, in addition to the per-credit fees by location, and will be calculated based on the prefixes of the classes the student is enrolled in. ¹RESIDENCY CRITERIA

- ND Resident - students that have graduated from a ND high school, or have been a legal resident of ND for the 12 months prior to the first term of enrollment, or other approved groups as outlined in ND Century Code 15-10-19.1.
- MN Reciprocity - students that have graduated from a MN high school within the 12 month period prior to the first semester of enrollment at NDSCS, or have submitted the MN Reciprocity Application and have been approved.
- U.S. Resident - students that are U.S. citizens and have not been approved for a ND Resident or MN Reciprocity rate; students from Manitoba and Saskatchewan.
- International - students that are citizens of another country (excluding the Canadian provinces of Manitoba and Saskatchewan) and have not been approved for a ND Resident, MN Reciprocity or U.S. Resident rate.

The above amounts are estimates and are subject to change. Actual expenses will vary depending on student program, credits and living arrangements.
