IAC

Senator Larson stated that IAC talked about school reimbursement. The executive team is now assembling care packages for each institution due to delays caused by individual items taking too long. The issue of quorum was raised but has not been resolved, and elections are approaching.

• SLAC

Vice President Maudal stated said SLAC members gave updates on testifying in the legislature, specifically regarding House Bill 1181, which concerns gender usage in North Dakota's Century Code. The NDSA passed a resolution opposing DNA testing for gender. Additionally, NDSA is in favor of sign-on bonuses for teachers but disagrees with eliminating DEI on campuses

SAC

Senator Martinson stated that the NDUS met on the 13th. NDSA is making a form to purchase merch, higher ed day to meet legislators and discuss our standpoint, talked about how fall would be the best time to do it, open to all students, discussed removing an NDSA to attend this or have multiple higher ed day, Instagram takeovers for all senators to email 3 pictures, what you do, and how you're involved. Promote merchandise or giveaways on Instagram. Distribution of products to get rid of 4 full boxes of over 200 note pads and promoting NDSAs, talked about banners, flags, and state fleet access is different for all colleges

Vice President Maudal stated the assembly passed three resolutions: one on sign-on bonuses, one on gender usage, and one on discriminatory usage.

Administrative Assistant Bohnenstingl stated we discussed student fees at different campuses, including UND's \$700 fee and Williston's \$100 fee, with a suggestion to raise fees annually by 1% without requiring a vote. Max Eriksrud recommends raising every year by 1% without having to vote on it.
